## 1. Approval of Agenda & Minutes

Approve and authorize the President to sign an amendment to the Self-Funded Group Medical and Dental Benefits Plan among Clark County, the Clark County Water Reclamation District, the University Medical Center of Southern Nevada, the Las Vegas Convention and Visitor Authority, the Las Vegas Valley Water District, the Clark County Regional Flood Control District, the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada, the Southern Nevada Health District, the Henderson District of Public Libraries, the Mount Charleston Fire Protection District, the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and the Moapa Valley Fire Protection District adopting an amended Self-Funded Group Medical and Dental Benefits Plan, effective January 1, 2021.
- 3. Approve and authorize the President to sign an amendment to the Interlocal Agreement among Clark County, the Clark County Water Reclamation District, the University Medical Center of Southern Nevada, the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority, the Las Vegas Valley Water District, the Clark County Regional Flood Control District, the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada, the Southern Nevada Health District, the Henderson District Public Libraries, the Mount Charleston Fire Protection District, the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and the Moapa Valley Fire Protection District establishing the rates for the Self-Funded Group Medical and Dental Benefits Plan, effective January 1, 2021.
- 4. Approve an amendment to the contract with Health Plan of Nevada, Inc., to provide health maintenance organization services to District employees.

- 5. Approve and authorize the General Manager to sign an agreement between The Howard Hughes Company, LLC, and the District for construction of the 4125 Zone North Reservoir.
- 6. Approve and authorize the General Manager to sign an agreement between The Howard Hughes Company, LLC, and the District for construction of the 4125 Zone Pumping Station.
- 7. Approve and authorize the General Manager to sign an agreement between The Howard Hughes Company, LLC, and the District for design and construction of the 3665 Zone North Pipeline Phase III.

FINAL ACTION:

A motion was made by Director Jones to approve staff's recommendations for item numbers 5, 6 and 7. Director Brown disclosed that he is employed by the Las Vegas Aviators, who is owned by the Howard Hughes Corporation, and will still vote on these items. The motion was approved.

8. Approve and adopt a resolution concerning the refinancing of water projects, making a finding that no increase in the rate of an ad valorem tax is anticipated with respect to the issuance of General Obligation (Limited Tax) (Additionally Secured by SNWA Pledged Revenues) Refunding Bonds, in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$534,705,000, in one or more series to refinance all or any portion of the Bonds, and requesting that the Clark County Debt Management Commission approve the finding.

President Kirkpatrick asked staff to compile a list of all outstanding refinance issuances for both the District and the Southern Nevada Water Authority for the upcoming Debt Management Commission meeting.

FINAL ACTION: A motion was made by Vice President Gibson to adopt the resolution. The motion was approved.

9. Approve and adopt a resolution concerning the refinancing of water projects, making a finding that no increase in the rate of an ad valorem tax is anticipated with respect to the issuance of General Obligation (Limited Tax) (Additionally Secured by Pledged Revenues) Refunding Bonds, in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$82,610,000, in one or more series to refinance all or any portion of the Bonds, and requesting that the Clark County Debt Management Commission approve the finding.

FINAL ACTION: A motion was made by Director Naft to adopt the resolution. The motion was approved.

Ed Uehling expressed gratitude for the clarification on the refinancing of water projects.

The 2020-21 Budget Plan's total sources of funds are projected to be \$679.6 million, or a

5 percent increase as compared to the 2019-10 Adopted Budget Plan. The increase is largely due to the LVVWD's planned \$100 million new money debt issuance.

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
